(www.discoverdorchester.co.uk). Visitors can access the TIP during Shire Hall opening times from Mon-Sat from 10am to 4pm. The TIP is staffed by friendly, knowledgeable volunteers who are passionate about the town and eager to share their local insights. It is important to note that the TIP and website will not serve as a booking platform for travel or accommodation nor a council help desk.

## Town Hall Bust Identity Confirmed

One of the questions often asked by those visiting the Town Hall in the Corn Exchange is 'who is the lady portrayed in the bust?'

Thanks to some precarious ladder work and research by Ian Gosling, Chairman of the Civic Society, we can now say with certainty that it is a young Queen Victoria. The bust is marble and was carved by Joseph Durham (1814-77), a leading sculptor of the Victorian age.



The work postdates the construction by Benjamin Ferrey of the Corn Exchange in 1847-8, and it might well have been installed as part of the works which accompanied the installation of the Clock Tower in 1864.

## Coronation of King Charles III



On the evening of Saturday 6 May the town marked the occasion of King Charles III's Coronation by lighting the beacon at Salisbury Fields. Prior to the beacon being lit, those present were treated to live music from the Decadettes and Classical Soprano, Laura Sharley. There was also a very special performance from a children's choir made up of children from local primary schools. Although the day had been rather damp, the rain stayed away and the beacon roared into life at the second attempt of lighting.

### Thomas Hardy's Birthday

On Sunday 4 June the town celebrated the birthday of one of its most famous residents – Thomas Hardy. The high street was closed to traffic to enable an incredible array of Victorian and Thomas Hardy themed activities including, penny farthing displays, steam engines, Victorian crafts and demonstrations, talks and tours, ragged Victorians, performances from the New Hardy Players and much more.

The Town Council processed in full regalia from the Corn Exchange up the high street to the Thomas Hardy statue where the Chairman of the Thomas Hardy Society and Mayor gave readings and paid tribute to the great **author before each laying a wreath**.



Returning down the high street, the party was treated to a performance from the New Hardy Players before stopping to pay tribute and lay a wreath at another famous Dorchester author, William Barnes.

Joining the procession this year was a civic party from Dorchester's twin town Lübbecke in Germany.

#### Dorchester holds its first sustainable fashion week!

ReThink Fashion Dorchester recently took place from 22 to 29 April. The event was all about highlighting the importance of prolonging the life of our clothing and sharing what we can all do to make our fashion choices more eco-friendly.

ReThink Fashion Week included a week-long pop-up SwapShop in Brewery Square and 15 workshops on upcycling, mending and making. To top it all off, there was a sustainable fashion show at Dorset Museum. The week was very successful with around 1400 items re-homed at the SwapShop with any extra clothing donated to local homeless charities. At the fashion show, there was a panel of sustainable fashion experts, a catwalk with over 70 pre-loved, upcycled, or handmade outfits shown and a charity shop sale. The electric atmosphere made for a great night of sustainable fashion.
