1. APOLOGIES

Gosling (Dorchester Civic Society), M. Woodgate (Dorchester Heritage Magazine), J. Wallis (Blue Badge Tourist Guides) and R. Raine (National Trust).

2. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

5. HERITAGE TOURISM STRATEGY

(a) <u>Heritage Tourism Strategy – Progress and Presentation</u>

The Committee received a progress report from the Tourism Development Officer which updated it on the work undertaken against the agreed Tourism Strategy Action Plan. It was noted that:

- Strategic thinking was required on how to allocate funds.
- A birthday celebration for Thomas Hardy involved working with Visit Dorset to attract interest from other areas in Dorset.
- Henges and Hillforts was taking place.
- Dorset Museum suggested more advanced planning of future events, they were currently planning a series of Roman activities for next year.
- There was appetite for a Roman festival or May Day festival next year.

Members thanked the Tourism Development Officer for all the work being undertaken.

Dorchester Tourism Partnership Meeting Notes

04.10.2022 Corn Exchange

Attending: 18 Apologies: 9

1. Welcome and Introductions

- Tamsin Little, Shire Hall Museum welcomed all to the meeting and thanked Dorchester Arts for hosting the meeting at Corn Exchange.
- The group welcomed two new attendees:
 - Jessica Matthews who has taken over from Sarah Roff at Visit Dorset
 - o Lisa Cartwright who was representing Dorchester BID in Phil and Neil's absence

2. Election of new Chair

Kirsty Schmidt from The Kings Arms was elected as the new Chair of the partnership and it was agreed that Tamsin Little will step in and chair whilst Kirsty is on maternity leave.

3. Officer Update

Matilda gave a presentation update on her recent work in the tourism partnership. The presentation given at the meeting is attached – it has been adapted so that it can be read standalone and reflects decisions made at the meeting.

Due to work load, time off over the summer and loss of Support Officer role the following projects are still ongoing and progress will be updated at the next meeting:

- Sustainable Tourism
- Action Plan and vision sub groups
- Big Projects workshop
- Website newsletter
- KPI setting
- Pedestrian crossing
- Tour operator section on website
- Website review

4. Review of Summer 2022 and plan for Summer 2023

Matilda gave a presentation evaluating the success of the two summer campaigns ("A Day out in Dorchester" and "Dorchester's Summer of Sunflowers"). There were things that went well and things that didn't work so well with both. Lots of lessons have been learnt from these campaigns. Separate evaluation documents for both campaigns are attached to these meeting notes. Comments from the partnership included:

- The weather this summer was exceptional so everyone wanted to be at the beach. Recommendation to try the campaign during Easter or half term when weather is more changeable.
- Summer of Sunflowers was popular with listeners of Keep 106
- Dorchester is not the only place with a sunflower trail so the campaign need to be very big to make an impact
- Cash is preferred in Dorchester so if we do another fundraiser, need to be able have cash collection tins. Could do "round up" in businesses or have 5 p of every coffee going to

fundraiser. Could have apple pay or google pay QR codes as young people prefer to pay by phone.

• Recommendation to get feedback from tourists via BID Ambassadors doing short questionnaires (agreed by Lisa), via printed questionnaires in cafes and other places where people dwell, purchase iPad and use a survey monkey and kiosk app, Dorchester Arts could email out survey monkey link to people who have attended shows.

Plan for Summer 2023:

- Run Day out in Dorchester again. Call all of the Holiday Parks instead of email and post. Try campaign at Easter too as weather more changeable.
- Run Summer of Sunflowers again but do it bigger next year and have more ways that people can donate.
- Create survey monkey (or similar) to measure impact of campaigns in future with tourists and print out surveys for use by Dorchester BID Ambassadors and to put in places where people dwell.

5. Accessibility

Matilda showed the new functionality of the website for accessibility information and asked the partnership for ideas of how we could get over 400 businesses on the website to update their information and add in their accessibility information.

The group decided that an email to all businesses should be sent out first to see how many would do it themselves. If this doesn't work then employing someone to go round and visit each business and amend their entry with them would be the next step.

Duchy of Cornwall will be sending out an email to all businesses at end of year and this can be included.

- Actions:
 - **Matilda -** Email out to businesses to be sent out re. accessibility and updating businesses
 - **All -** Information about updating information and adding accessibility to be sent out with newsletters to businesses by Duchy of Cornwall and any others.

6. Totally Locally

The partnership heard about a new business led initiative in Dorchester called Totally Locally. They agreed to support the initiative, work collaboratively with them and are keen to create a space for them on the Discover Dorchester website.

- Actions:
 - **Matilda –** to contact Totally Locally to offer space on website and continue collaborative working.

7. Updates from partners – recent tourism highlights and upcoming plans

- **BID** Ambassadors have been working over the summer and are now back to two days per week. Re ballot Summer 2023. Ran Summer Live music. Will be doing Shoppers Guide in the Spring. Will be doing Christmas advertising on radio again.
- **Duchy of Cornwall** New businesses opening. Independent market is back this October and Christmas Market will be on again this year. Spring 2023 there will be the Spring Agricultural Show in Jubilee Hall again.
- Shire Hall Museum Had a successful summer due to the Agatha Christie exhibition. Collaborating with BID on the super sleuth was great promotion. Events in the café are increasing. Focusing on the community at the moment. Lots of Halloween and Christmas events. Have an immigration and refugee exhibition starting in December. New Director of Shire Hall Museum starts on Monday.
- Keep Military Museum Have a new exhibition "Bite the Bullet" starting on Monday 24th
 October 2022
- **Dorchester Arts** Had a great summer for outdoor theatre. Corn Exchange now fully open and Hardye Theatre at Thomas Hardye School. Now has more time to work in

partnership so keen to meet up with others. Already working with Dorset Museum on some 80's events to complement their 80's exhibition.

- **Dorchester Town Council** Have run a series of very successful summer events that were very well attended.
- **Dorchester Civic Society** Have run a tour of the water meadows and are partnering up with Salisbury Civic Society and running some reciprocal visiting events. The Civic Society was also involved in Heritage Open Day; has been working with media students from Thomas Hardye School to promote the town to young people; and is working with Dorchester Town Council on the visioning project for the town centre.
- **Roman Town House** The Roman Town House has become a wedding venue. Been doing lots of schools work and different events.
- **Dorset Museum** October is the last month of Hardy's Wessex exhibition. Was involved in Heritage Open Day and the Home of Hillforts and Henges. 80's Exhibition opens soon. 150 people attended Wedding Fair.
- Heritage Magazine Working on the Christmas Magazine. Coordinated Home of Hillforts and Henges and Heritage Open Day.
- Keep 106 Celebrating 4th year of radio station. Find getting out to events very successful way to promote and engage with audience.
- Alistair Chisholm Running event in The Kings Arms in Casterbridge Room.
- **The King's Arms** Have managed to get coverage in The Times, Guardian and Food and Travel Magazine. Event schedule in Casterbridge Room is full.
