## Home Library



Dorset Council and the RVS are working together to provide a free non-contact Doorstep Delivery Service to residents that cannot easily get to their local library, either short term or long term.

Books are chosen by volunteers or staff at each library, based on individual preferences, and delivered to your front door every 3 weeks; they can also pick up and return books to the library.

All volunteers have strict safety guidelines and all necessary risk assessments have been carried out. They will only enter your house with your permission and will keep a safe distance at all times.

## Play Equipment at The Great Field

The Great Field is now reaching its final stage of development. Co-ordinated and funded by the Duchy of Cornwall, construction of Dorset's largest free play area started in September.



The largest pieces of play equipment are modelled on some of Poundbury's landmark buildings, including The Whistling Witch, The Buttercross and Brownsword Hall.

Earlier work on landscaping and footpaths have transformed the open spaces, while the opening of the Pavilion in the Park in the Spring provided much needed facilities.

Once completed, in Spring 2022, the park will be finished and management of the site will transfer to the Town Council.

# Town Centre Masterplan

In responding to the Dorset Council Local Plan options paper earlier this year the Town Council expressed concern regarding out of date policies proposed for the centre of the town, particularly those which continued to focus on retail growth. The Town Council has since been considering its position on the key long term risk that retail premises will not be reoccupied and that Dorset Council and other workers will not return to town centre offices at pre-Covid levels.

At the same time we recognise that such problems also present opportunities to consider the potential to convert premises into residential properties which will, in turn, sustain the town centre; and will also alter the traffic movements and parking issues that have traditionally caused problems for residents.

We are planning to consult key partners such as the Civic Society and business groups on our views over the winter, prior to a wider discussion with residents later in the new year.

We will also continue to press our point with the Dorset Council, that a clear masterplan is required for the town centre as part of a Local Plan that will control development of Dorchester and the wider area for the next 20+ years.

# KM students visit our Greenspaces

A huge thank you to Kingston Maurward students for surveying and improving some of our outdoor spaces. Two groups of Level 3 Wildlife, Ecology and Conservation students, supported by their lecturer Brian Heppenstall, recently visited green spaces across the town.

First year students surveyed sites for biodiversity and recreational potential, providing practical experience for students and useful information for how we could look after our spaces.

Second year students cleared vegetation from the pond at the Local Nature Reserve on the Mill Stream, to reduce its impact on wildlife. The vegetation is left on the banks so that minibeasts can safely find their way back into the water. The work will help to increase biodiversity at the site. Brian hopes to bring students back to Dorchester in the new year to continue their studies and to help us to continue to improve our green spaces.

### **Dorchester TAG**

Dorchester has a new Transport Action Group, set up by local people. It will work with TAGs across Dorset, building on a 20 year old government initiative to get local people more involved with transport decisions. TAGs have no direct power, but are consulted on by Dorset Council and help to engage people in transport issues and make sure that local people have a voice in transport decisions.

The Dorchester area has considerable issues in trying to build a transport system which provides fair mobility for everyone in both urban and rural settings, with the added impetus of reducing the significant CO2 impact of transport.

For individuals, this means a move towards active walking and cycling over short distances, more use of public transport (buses, trains) and a move to electricity and hydrogen fuel cell vehicles.

We need to change our transport system to one that serves all local people as well as being kinder to the planet. The TAG hopes to play a strong part in this by engaging local people in decision making and choices at all levels. For more info contact Stewart Palmer shartandpalmer@gmail.com.
