# **Trenches on the Bowling Green**

This Spring we have been undertaking archaeological studies on the old Bowling Green, prior to the building of tennis courts on the site.



Two trenches were excavated, revealing the chalk tops of three large ditches running parallel to West Walks, which sits on the western wall of Roman Durnovaria. The dig also revealed evidence of a prehistoric, possibly recorded before works on the tennis courts start later this summer.

Meanwhile work continues to introduce new features to

the Gardens. This summer a new carpet bed adjacent to West Walks will feature Dippy the Dinosaur in readiness for his visit in early 2018, while a rock climbing boulder is also planned for later in the year.

The Gardens Clock will be refurbished from September, with a full clean and repair of the clock face and new paintwork. Next to the clock tower and the tennis courts in an area shaded by mature trees, a new fernery Reserve and some of the key funders. has been established.

# **New Home for Dorchester Boxing**

The Town Council is working with Dorchester Amateur Boxing Club to convert some redundant changing rooms at the Weymouth Avenue Pavilion to create a small gym. The Club has been operating since 2003 but has never had a home of its own.

The Boxing Club secured £25,000 from planning monies paid by the Duchy of Cornwall for the Poundbury development and are matching this from funds they have raised themselves over the years. Additional funds are being sought from lottery and other sources and the Town Council will provide the building and oversee the construction project. The hall will be kitted out by the Neolithic, ditch, which will be Boxing Club with a boxing ring, bags and mats.

# **Town Council responds** to Local Plan Review

In March the Town Council prepared its response to the West Dorset District Local Plan review, which is due for public inspection in 2020.

Faced with a need to identify land for 4,000+ houses and flats across West Dorset, Weymouth and Portland, the District Council has identified possible housing sites to the north, west and south of, as well as in, the town.

Working with a specialist planning advisor, Feria Urbanism, the Town Council consulted key local stakeholders including Dorchester Civic Society, Magna Housing and two neighbouring parishes, to understand how they felt about the Local Plan consultation.

In its response the Town Council asked that the District Council demonstrate clearly that it had fully explored all alternative options before deciding in favour of more development in and adjacent to Dorchester.

Turning to the specific proposals the Town Council highlighted a series of planning and design challenges facing development, particularly north of the water meadows, which would need to be addressed for development to work. These included connecting new developments to the town, the delivery of affordable housing, increased traffic around and into the town and the impacts of growth on the town centre.

The Town Council has requested that, whatever the final proposals are for new housing in and around Dorchester, a town-wide masterplan is put in place, which responds positively to the concerns raised, before any new building starts.

# **Town Council backs Town Centre Wi-fi**

The Town Council has added its backing to an initiative led by Dorchester BID for free public wi-fi in the town centre, offering £5,000 to install the aerials and other infrastructure required to make it happen.

Dorchester BID is working closely with the Superfast Broadband team from Dorset County Council to deliver free public wi-fi from Top o' Town, down into High West and High East Street, along South Street and into Weymouth Avenue. They are also working with the Town Council to explore how to introduce wi-fi into the Borough Gardens as part of the project.

The main funders are Dorset County and West Dorset District Councils, while Dorchester BID has agreed to fund the operation of the scheme once it is operational.

The service will make it easier to provide information about facilities and heritage tourism, including up to the moment news about events, making it easier and more attractive for visitors and residents to spend more time in town. It will also present improved marketing opportunities for local businesses.

## **Cavernoma Alliance UK** named as Mayor's Charity

Alongside the well known and highly regarded Dorchester CAB, the other nominated charity for funds raised by Susie Hosford during her Mayoral year is a locally born charity providing a nation-wide service.

The charity was set up by local man Ian Stuart when he realised that there was no available help for the increasing numbers of people affected by the Cavernoma condition.

A cavernoma consists of a series of abnormal blood vessels in the brain which, under certain conditions, causes epileptic seizures, dizziness, slurred speech and other related symptoms.
