Pavilion in the Park opens for Coffee

PiP café and community hub opened on The Great Field in April, following a successful fundraising campaign by its new owner/operator, the Alcohol Education Trust, a national charity based in Dorset.



The Town Council funded the toilets attached to the building, one with baby changing and the other with full disabled facilities, and will contribute for their cleaning so that they can be used by all the park's visitors.

Busy from day one, the café is an added reason for clubs and residents to enjoy the Great Field. It is open 9 - 5, Tuesday - Sunday with homemade and local food and drinks. The family and dog friendly space is also a book exchange and exhibits art by the under 25's.

Kings Road Trees

As part of the Council's Climate Emergency commitment, over the winter our Outdoor Services Team planted 400 native species trees and 1,300 native whips in the green space at Kings Road, adjacent to the River Frome.

Many of the trees were funded by Dorset County Hospital as tree replacement commitments associated with their project to build a Multi-storey car park at their Williams Avenue site. Dorset Council have also provided funds to replace trees removed as part of their now completed project to improve the Roman Town House at their County Hall site.

Planting will continue in late 2021 and a formal naming of the space to commemorate the response to the Covid epidemic will take place in the new year.

News from the **Borough Gardens**

A new space has been created at the southern end of the Borough Gardens, adjacent to the tennis courts.

A Rose Garden has been planted by the Parks Team, with fragrant English roses named after authors and literary characters, funded by two local donors.

Benches and paving have been added and surrounding hedges have been reduced to provide a welcome space.

Elsewhere in the Gardens two shield beds will be planted this summer; one to commemorate 100 years of the Royal British Legion, the other as a Thank You to all those involved in the Covid response.

Dorchester West Railway Station Ramp

One of the longest projects on the Town Council's list is



finally underway. Originally conceived over a decade ago, an access ramp is being installed from the northbound platform to ground level at Williams Avenue, to enable disabled and pushchair users to board and alight trains more easily.

The project, managed by Network Rail, received funding from

Dorset Council plus contributions from the Town Council and the Friends of the Station.

War Memorial

The town's War Memorial on South Walks has been the focus of centenary commemorations in recent years and has itself now reached 100 years of age.

It was first unveiled on 24 May 1921, built by local monument mason, Algernon Grassby, with bronze plaques bearing 239 names of the fallen manufactured by George Membury at the Model Brass Foundry in Colliton Street; all installed at a cost of £400.

The Council has recently undertaken renovation works to close some of the joints in the stonework, clean the stone and tidy up the base of the monument.

Municipal Buildings & Dorchester Arts

Works continue on the £2.5 Million refurbishment of the Corn Exchange and other rooms in the building.

The first full reroofing of the Council Chamber and Corn Exchange since they were built in the mid 1800's is now nearing completion.

Focus has now shifted to the conversion and extension of the rear of the building to provide multifunctional, accessible meeting, dressing room and food preparation space, as well as replacement offices for the Town Council and Dorchester Arts. These works will also enable the installation of a new biomass boiler system, the key part of the Council's Climate Emergency programme, part funded by a grant from Low Carbon Dorset and Government Renewable Heating Incentive payments.

By the end of the summer the Corn Exchange will have been refitted with new lighting, sound and projection, as well as retractable seating to enable the room to provide a 150 seat theatre venue.

After an outdoor season based at Maumbury Rings Dorchester Arts will reopen in late September with a packed autumn programme.

Further works will be carried out to the front of the building in 2023 to open up the space for use by theatre goers and to allow better use for community

Council Summer Events Programme

Planning for our summer events programme, including for the August Bank Holiday weekend and our Cinema event, is undertaken each year in

This year we took the decision that we should not put on large scale free events, both because of the uncertainty associated with Pandemic lockdowns and because of the risk that our free events might result in the spread of any residual virus.

Most of the smaller partner led events in the Borough Gardens are similarly affected. We will, however, be putting on a number of smaller concerts involving local bands from the Borough Gardens Bandstand - see the notice board in the Gardens for more details.

Supporting Citizens Advice

The Citizens Advice in Dorchester has continued to provide free, independent and impartial advice throughout the pandemic and lockdown period.

From the start of the pandemic it became clear that there was a significant increase in demand for Employment Advice and an expert team was put together to meet this need.

When funding for the new team ran out in May the Town Council stepped in to provide a £13,600 grant to enable the service to continue until March 2022. The Council is in discussions regarding longer term support for the service.

Citizens Advice will continue to support residents in the recovery phase as shops and businesses reopen and people return to work; building financial resilience in the months ahead to help maintain housing and budgets.
