

### HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY 2026

In 2026, Dorchester will commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day with an event at the Corn Exchange on Tuesday 27th January. The event is hosted by the Mayor of Dorchester, Cllr Andy Canning, and all the community are invited to attend. The event will be a less formal drop-in session from 10am until midday and will be an opportunity to reflect on the Holocaust and other genocides, and to look at displays by local schools. Feel free to join us to light a candle and leave a message of hope for the future.

### A SUMMER PACKED WITH FUN

Once again, the residents of Dorchester have benefitted from a packed summer of events hosted on the Council's beautiful outdoor spaces and blessed with hot weather.

Borough Gardens has been the focus for much of the town's outdoor entertainment with the Dorchester Round Table's Cider Festival, the One World Festival, the Palestinian Cultural Festival and the ever-popular Anonymous youth festival rounding off the summer.

The Cider Festival is perhaps the biggest event held in the Gardens and attracts thousands of people throughout the day – whilst raising money for local good causes.





An emotional highlight of the Anonymous festival was a moving tribute by many young musicians to Mickey Wills, the organiser of Pop Club, who passed recently. Over the years, Mickey had supported and mentored many of Dorchester's up and coming young musicians and was a key partner in Anonymous for over 15 years.

Many of these events will return for the summer of 2026, so look out for the dates on Discover Dorchester.

### HERITAGE OPEN DAY 2025

Dorchester is a town rich in history spanning several thousand years. In September, the council worked with members of the Dorchester Joint Heritage Committee to celebrate the town's history as part of the national Heritage Open Day programme. Residents and visitors booked free places on guided walks around the town centre and Poundbury, and tours led by experts in Dorset Museum & Art Gallery, Dorset History Centre and Shire Hall Museum.



You could also try your hand at bell ringing up St Peter's Church tower or see Victorian soldiers of the Nothe Fort Artillery in action in Borough Gardens. A particular highlight was a tour of Sunninghill Prep School with Jeremy Pope, the great grandson of Alfred Pope who built the house originally known as South Court in 1893.



### LOOKING FORWARD TO EVENTS NEXT YEAR

The **Dorchester Science Festival** will be taking place in 2026 between 6th-15th March with a wide range of science-themed activities across different venues in town.

The Festival will include talks, demonstrations, and the opportunity to try some hands-on experiments yourself – with activities to suit all ages. The Festival will also include the flagship Family Science Day offering fun-filled interactive displays for children aged 4+. The events will be free but some sessions may need to be booked – so keep an eye on Discover Dorchester and on the Dorchester Science Festival socials for further details.

### A NEW KITE FESTIVAL FOR 2026

Dorchester Town Council and the Dorchester Tourism Partnership are planning the town's first Kite Festival on the 6th June 2026. This community event will not only include a range of family activities and entertainment but also the White Horse Kite Flyers demonstrating many of their huge and beautiful kites including dragons, octopuses and whales. The event will take place on The Great Field as it's a very windy location and ideal for large outdoor events.

The day after (Sunday 7th June) the Dorchester Lions Club will be using The Great Field for their ever-popular Summerfest family funday – so it's going to be a wonderful weekend.

### LOOKING BACK AT DORCHESTER'S PLAY AREAS - A LEGACY OF IMPROVEMENT



The town's 15 play areas offer a wide range of equipment designed to cater to children of all ages and abilities. These well-maintained spaces have become beloved gathering spots for families, with regular weekly safety inspections ensuring the safety and enjoyment of visitors.

But it wasn't always this way. The transformation of the town's play areas began in the mid-1980s when the first major wave of refurbishments by the Council brought them up to a reasonable standard. Prior to this, many of the sites had fallen into disrepair, with outdated equipment and concerns over safety.

In 2005, the Town Council undertook a further upgrade of facilities, introducing new play equipment across several locations. This commitment to ongoing improvement has continued ever since, with regular enhancements to meet the needs of the growing community. The latest play area is the newly opened site at The Great Field, officially inaugurated by the then Prince Charles in May 2022. This amazing play area featured bespoke wooden structures that mirror iconic buildings from the nearby Poundbury estate. The Great Field play area has quickly become a favourite destination for families from across Dorchester.

As the town continues to grow, the commitment to providing play areas and open spaces remains at the heart of the Town Council's vision, ensuring that future generations have spaces to explore, play, and connect.
