HANGING BASKETS RETURN TO SOUTH STREET

Dorchester Town Council has agreed to replace the heritage lampposts so we can bring back hanging baskets to South Street! We'll be placing the hanging baskets along South Street as well as looking at making some changes to the Town Pump area. This fantastic development is part of a larger plan to revitalise this area by opening it up to create some communal space around the pump and improving seating by adding more heritage benches. We'll also be investigating options for repaving and replanting the area to bring back some of its colour!



DORCHESTER WALKING FESTIVAL EVENTS NOW LIVE FOR BOOKING!

Dorchester will be hosting its first walking festival, during national walking month. The event will run from 13th to 21st May 2023 with an exciting schedule of over 40 walks and activities to be enjoyed.

It will start in Borough Gardens at 5am with the family-friendly Dawn Chorus to identify local birds and for the grand finale, will finish with a rousing "Beat the Bounds" around the old town walks with the town crier, making some noise, and enjoying pop-up surprises along the way.

Almost half of the walks are free. You can join in with friends, enjoy a stroll with family, and connect with new people outdoors. There are also great opportunities to find out more about the town and its fascinating past, including an Imaginary walk around 17th century Dorchester at Dorset Museum. There really is something for everyone – all ages and fitness levels.

TOTALLY TUBULAR!

The Town Council recently managed the removal of two large conker trees outside Coffee#1 in the town centre.



Works were carried out after a climbing survey revealed decay. As works were carried out the decay proved to be more extensive than anticipated. Some sound sections of wood have been retained to be made into informal benches for the town's open spaces and wood chip has been used on the fernery in Borough Gardens. New trees will be planted soon and shrub planting will take place in the autumn.

TRANSITION TOWN DORCHESTER – FEBRUARY 2023



Transition Town Dorchester (TTD) was started in 2008 in response to concerns about climate change and fossil fuel use in particular. For most of our history we have run the Railway Orchard, and also the Community Farm and Orchard to the south of Poundbury, where we have a large polytunnel, outdoor raised beds, wildlife ponds, geese and hens, and beehives. We have planted almost 1.5km of hedgerows in the area, involving local people. TTD has also taken part in many town events concerned with environmental and community issues.

We believe in building community, then creating resilience in this community by learning new skills, sharing knowledge, working together, and making wise use of precious resources. Anyone is welcome to join us, whether to take advantage of a large area for gardening and fresh air, to learn new skills (e.g. gardening, poultry management, beekeeping, scything), to enjoy being part of a community, to be part of a group striving for a greener way of living. We wholeheartedly support what Rob Hopkins, the founder of the Transition Towns movement, says: 'When there are thousands of communities worldwide all weaving their bit in a larger tapestry, it adds up to something strong.'

DORCHESTER ACCESS GROUP (DAG)

TOWN'S PART OF COUNCIL TAX TO RISE 2%

The Town Council's share of the council tax will rise by a below inflationary 2% in April, with a Band D charge increasing by £4.04 to £206.21 a year, raising £1.68 million from the DT1 taxpayers.

Councillors considered a number of issues when setting the budget for 2023/24, including:

- A new annual budget for tree works in the town
- An increase in the grants budget to reflect higher demand with the current cost of living crisis
