Committee consideration of requests for parking restrictions (and similar) requiring a Traffic Regulation Order

At the meeting on 30 November 2015, the Planning and Environment Committee agreed to use a standard form to assess any new requests received by the Town Council from residents for new parking restrictions (and similar) that required a Traffic Regulation Order. The purpose of using the form was to make the process fairer, more transparent and robust both for residents making requests and for Councillors in assessing such requests.

Since the recent consultation on and approval of Dorset County Council's Consolidated Traffic Regulation Order for Dorchester, a number of residents have contacted the Committee Clerk with concerns about parking and traffic that may lead to requests for parking restrictions (or similar).

In the past such requests have been dealt with by the Planning and Environment Committee on an ad hoc basis and the Committee is now asked to consider if it wishes to take such requests on a more structured basis say twice a year e.g. Aug/September and Feb/March. This would allow for a more focussed debate on all requests received at that time.

The Committee is also asked if it would like to introduce a ranking system for requests that it receives and supports. This could involve using the points detailed in Dorset County Council's guidance for Town Councils more rigorously (see below):

Suitability	Is the introduction of a restriction suitable for the area? Consider the advantages and disadvantages. Does the road already have traffic calming features; such as signs, speed bumps and on-street parking? All these can contribute to road safety in one way or another. If the proposal does not meet DCC's various criteria, it is unlikely to be implemented.
Cost	Would the proposals be achievable financially? It is not a case of just of introducing a restriction, so consider the costs of advertisement, consultation and materials required, which can run into thousands of pounds. Dorset County Council's funding for traffic management has reduced substantially in recent years.

Opinion	Do other residents agree that there is an issue in the area? Would the proposal actually inconvenience others? If your concerns are related to traffic enforcement for driving offences, have you spoken to Dorset Police (Community Support Teams) to see if they can help? It may negate the need for any changes in the first place.
Impact	If implemented, would the restriction have the desired effect or will it actually introduce more problems? Will the introduction of a restriction just move the problem to another area?

The Town Clerk and Committee Clerk are seeking a meeting with Dorset County Council officers, dealing with Traffic Regulation Orders, to confirm their future processes for the consideration, assessment and ranking of TRO requests. The outcome of this meeting should allow the Town Council to align its processes better with DCC's.


South Gate Junction Traffic Regulation Order

This traffic regulation order will ban left turns from South Walks Road into Prince of Wales Road and right turns from Prince of Wales Road into South Walks Road in order to introduce pedestrian crossing facilities on South Walks Road closer to the desire line between Brewery Square and South Street and allow the existing crossing on South Walks Road to be removed.

These alterations are consistent with the DTEP aims to

- Support the economic prosperity of the town
- Increase pedestrian priority and freedom
- Improve access for cyclists, the elderly and disabled.

This traffic regulation order will be made in accordance with Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which allows orders to be made "for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising" or "for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians)" or "for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs".

1. 11A ST GEORGES ROAD, DORCHESTER, DT1 1PA WD/D/14/002449

Redevelop site by erection of 3 no. dwellings

An Appeal has been lodged with the Planning Inspectorate against West Dorset District Council's refusal of the above application. This is to proceed by way of written representations. The procedure to be followed is set out in Part 2 of the Town and Country Planning (Appeals) (Written Representations Procedure) (England) Regulations 2009. All representations to be received by 28 April 2016.

2. STRATTON HOUSE, 58-60 HIGH WEST STREET, DORCHESTER, DT1 1UT WD/D/15/000999

Change of use from office (B1) to residential (C3) (Change of Use)

The applicant made an appeal to the Planning Inspectorate against a failure of the local planning authority (WDDC) to give notice within the prescribed period of a decision on an application for planning permission.

The Planning Inspector allowed the appeal on 8 April 2016 and planning permission has been granted for change of use from B1 office to residential at Stratton House, 58-60 High West Street, Dorchester, Dorset DT1 1UZ, in accordance with the terms of the application, ref: WD/D/15/000999 dated 22 April 2015,

An application for costs, made by the appellant against the Council, is the subject of a separate decision.
