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WELCOME FROM THE NEW MAYOR



Dorchester's new Mayor, Cllr Les Fry BEM, has served on the Town Council since 2019. His chosen charities for his Mayoral year will be Prostate Cancer, People First Dorset and Dorchester Youth & Community Centre. Les will be supported by his wife Julie Fry BEM as Mayoress and by Cllr Robin Potter as Deputy Mayor.

At the annual Mayor Making ceremony in May, Les told the audience that he was born, educated and worked in West Dorset, including as the Police Inspector of Dorchester from 2003 until 2012. Les believes that he is perhaps the only person to hold the positions of Police Inspector and Mayor of our great town.

Les has four married sons who were all born and educated in Dorchester, three of whom still live locally. Les is a grandfather and a great grandfather.

He is very active in the town, as a member of Rotary, the Beerex organising Committee, the Hardy Half organising team, and volunteers most weeks at the Saturday Parkrun. Until recently Les was a trustee at Dorchester Youth & Community Centre.

NEW JAPANESE MAPLE BORDER IN BOROUGH GARDENS

A new Japanese maple border has been created in Borough Gardens between the fountain and West Walks.

Some larger trees in this area provide shade ideal for a range of maples requiring differing light conditions to produce their stunning colourful leaves. The new maples will be under-planted with relocated lower growing plants which will, over time, be removed as the trees grow and replaced with low growing shade tolerant species.

Over 30 maples have been planted, with bright leaf colours such as orange, red, yellow and green which will be very prominent in the autumn.

We're very grateful to the Friends of Borough Gardens and two private individuals who made generous donations towards the cost of the maples to be used in the project.



MARKETS HANDOVER DAY

April marked an exciting milestone for Dorchester, as the Town Council took on the running of our beloved markets at Cornhill and Fairfield.

DORCHESTER CAR BOOT FUND



Last year the Dorchester Market Car Boot Fund awarded £11,746 in grants to community organisations in the Dorchester area. The funding is generated by pitch fees from the Sunday morning car boot sale at Fairfield Market, and is now managed by Dorchester Town Council.

Successful organisations were invited to a celebration tea at the Town Hall in Dorchester in May to receive certificates handed out by Cllr Molly Rennie (Chair of the Dorchester Car Boot Fund Panel), Cllr Stella Jones (Chair of Dorset Council), and Mayoress of Dorchester, Mel Lane, with the Mayor of Dorchester, Councillor Andy Canning, in attendance.

Sports clubs, youth projects, projects for people with disabilities or long-term health issues, and projects tackling cost of living pressures were among those who benefitted from the funding.

MILESTONE FOR COMMUNITY HOUSING PROJECT



Work is well underway on Roman Corner - the Dorchester Area Community Land Trust's long-awaited development of 15 one-bedroom, social rent flats.

The start of construction was celebrated with a 'breaking ground' ceremony on 13th March hosted by the developers, AJC Construction, and attended by representatives of the Trust and partners including East Boro Housing Trust, Dorset Council and Dorchester Town Council.

DORCHESTER IS A WATERMARK TOWN!



Over the past year, the Town Council has been working together with the community and Wessex Water to help save water, protect the environment, and manage rainwater better in Dorchester. As a result, Dorchester Town Council have been accredited as a Watermark Town by Wessex Water, securing Dorchester's place within a network of concerned and responsible communities working towards a more sustainable future.

As part of the Town Council's Watermark project, Wessex Water provided 90 water butts which were distributed to tenants on our allotment sites across Dorchester. The butts were gratefully received by allotment holders, keen to play their part in water conservation and improve their plots!

We'll keep promoting sustainable practices, honouring our Watermark Town status, and completing water-themed projects. Next year, we'll be working with local schools to take part in an arts and education project that culminates with an interactive trail along the river.

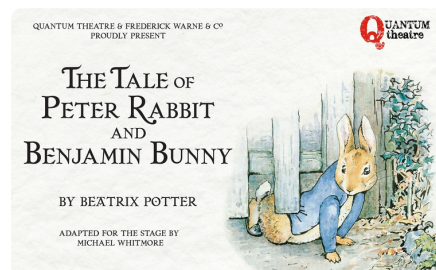
